

COLOUR

The durability of a film doesn't only depend on the adhesive and the film quality, but also on the colour stability of the film.

In general, black and white films have a longer life than coloured ones. Green and blue are more stable colours than, for example, red. This is due to the pigments used, for which the life span may differ, depending on the colour used.

In a lot of industries, standard colour tables are used to make work easier. The car and construction industries, for example, use the RAL colours, while the printing industry makes use of Pantone colours.

In this manual you will find a colour reference table of our Grafitack colours with their respective Pantone and RAL colours. **Please note that the references are only approximate.**
